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Waiver of Liability & Informed Consent Release

I, the undersigned, have enrolled myself and my dog in dog training classes, private consultations, workshops or other related activities (Classes) offered by Two Shields Dog Training Academy, LLC. By signing hereunder, I certify that I have been informed and understand that there is always some unavoidable risk of injury involved when working with animals, especially animals with behavioral issues. I acknowledge that dogs can be inherently difficult to control and that not all dogs will be under control at all times resulting in the possibility of injury to myself, my dog, my family members, or third parties. Additionally, I have had full opportunity to discuss all concerns I have about the foregoing risks with Two Shields Dog Training Academy, LLC and its authorized representatives. I have also made all inquiries and investigations to my satisfaction related to such risks, including, but not limited to, an examination of the training area (if applicable). I hereby accept and assume, without reservation, all risks associated with my participation in the Classes, including, but not limited to: the risks of any and all injuries to myself, my dog and any of my family members or third parties who may attend; the risks that my dog may cause injury to other persons and/or dogs involved in the Classes; and the risks that saliva, water, food, snow and/or other debris may be present in the training area. I have read and understand Two Shields Dog Training Academy, LLC's Training Facility Operating Policies, and agree to abide by them to the extent applicable. As lawful consideration for participating in the classes, I, for myself, my heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors and assigns (the "Releasing Party"), hereby waive, release, discharge and agree not to sue and to indemnify, defend and hold harmless Two Shields Dog Training Academy, LLC, and their members, managers, agents, and employees (the "Released Party") from any and all injuries, losses, claims and damages to any person or persons of any nature whatsoever, including claims arising from the Released Party's own negligence, and all costs associated therewith, including attorney's fees, court costs and consultant fees, arising from my participation in the Classes. This Waiver of Liability & Informed Consent Release shall be legally binding on the Releasing Party. Should the Releasing Party assert a claim to the contrary to what I have agreed to in this Waiver of Liability and Informed Consent Release, the claiming party shall be liable for all expenses (including attorney's fees, court costs and consultant fees) incurred by both the Releasing Party and the Released Party. No waiver or modification of any provision herein shall be valid unless expressly agreed to in writing by both the Released Party and the Releasing Party. I hereby consent to my dog being the subject of the photographs and/or audiovisual recording and authorize Two Shields Dog Training Academy, LLC and Rebekah Camp to cause the same to be exhibited for educational purposes as still photographs, transparencies, motion pictures, television, video or other similar media. I hereby release Two Shields Dog Training Academy, LLC and Rebekah Camp from any and all claims for damages for libel, slander, invasion of privacy or any other claim based on use of the above-described material(s). Every provision herein is intended to be severable. If any one or more of the provisions herein is found to be unenforceable or invalid, that shall not affect the other terms and provisions hereof, which shall remain binding and enforceable. 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“Sit”: “Sit” is used to place your dog in a sitting position.

“Down”: “Down” is used to place your dog in a lying position. You should not ask your dog to “down” when he jumps on you or on an object (ex. Kitchen table or couch) unless you want him to go into a lying position.

“Off”: “Off” is used to command your dog off of something (ex. When your dog jumps on you or up on the kitchen table or couch).

“Heel”: “Heel” is asking your dog to walk with its neck/shoulder region aligned with your knee, on the side your dog is trained to heel on (left/right). Your dog should not walk ahead, behind, or too far out to the side when this command is given.

“Place”: “Place” is a command used when you are asking your dog to stay within a specific area. This area should be somewhat small in proximity and have obvious boundaries (ex. Dog bed). This command is not used to ask your dog to stay in a specific room or specific area of the yard. Also a towel or mat may not have clear enough boundaries to be used as a place and may cause confusion.

“Your dog’s Name”: “Fido”, yes your dogs name can be a command. When your dogs name is called, your dog should completely stop what he is doing and give you his undivided attention. An example of this is when you are in a very distracting environment (dog park, vets office), and you call your dogs name he should break from what he is doing and turn to you. After he has given his attention another command can be given (ex. Here, sit, down, etc.)

“Here/Come”: When using “Here” or “Come” your dog should immediately stop what he is doing and return to the sound of your voice. Your dog should recall without stopping for anything along the way (ex. Peeing, smelling the ground, etc.). Your dog should take the most direct route to you.

“Leave it”: “Leave it” is used when you ask your dog to leave something alone, not bite, chew, or chase. An example of this is when your dog starts to put its head in the trash can, you say “leave it,” your dog should then leave the trash can alone. Or if your dog starts to chase the neighbor’s cat, you say “leave it” and then you probably want to call him/her back to you!!!!

“Let’s Go”: A command used when you are wanting your dog to walk with you. Unlike “Heel”, this command is a more relaxed walk. You are only asking your dog to walk with you in the same direction, not necessarily in the “Heel” position. While on-leash, your dog may walk in front of you, but never pull on the leash.

“Free”: We do not teach the word stay, instead we teach your dog a release word using “Free.” “Free” is used to release your dog from any of the above commands. Once you have given the free command you should encourage your dog to break from whatever command he is in.

*Remember Timing, Consistency, and Reinforcement. If you are lacking any of the three, training with your Canine will be slow and frustrating for both you and him/her. Your Commands should be given one at a time and in a clear manner that your canine can understand. One command follows another, since we don’t use the word stay, your dog should continue performing the command given until released from that command.
